

Rules of Entry for all Classes

- All disputes (if any) to be decided by the Committee of Management, and not subject to any proceedings of law.
- Any dissent with an official of the show could lead to the possibility of disqualification.
- Objections (if any) must be made in writing to the Secretary on Show day, and any expenses incurred must be paid by the person against whom the Committee give their decision.
- Great care will be taken to prevent accidents to Exhibits but the Committee will not be responsible for any damage done to the same.
- The Stewards and/or Veterinary Officer are empowered to have any animal considered by them to be suffering from any infectious or contagious disease to be immediately removed from the Showground.
- The judge's decision is final.
- All livestock to be bona fida the property of the Exhibitor.
- No animal to be entitled to a prize if shown singly in a class and thought unworthy by the Judges.
- Any veterinary or farrier expenses incurred at the Show are the responsibility of the owner.
- No responsibility will be accepted for any injury, damage, or accident to any persons, animals or property.
- It shall be deemed a condition of entry to the Showground that all persons agree to indemnify the organisers and land owners against any legal action arising from any incident.
- Riders should be wearing appropriate safety equipment and tack must be safe and adequate for purpose.
- Riders do so at their own risk
- All uncollected prize money on the day will be donated to charity
